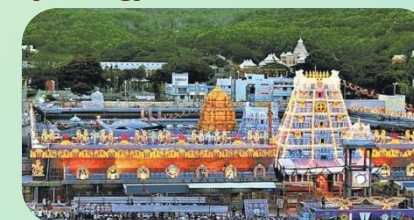

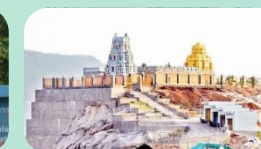
TIRUPATI



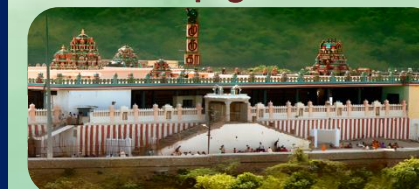
